In the final semester, examination held for 2020 batch, 85.71 per cent have passed out of which 73 per cent became eligible for degree certificates (17 with distinction and 56 with first class). ### **P G Programme**

I may report that in response to our application for a new P G programme M A Tourism and Aviation Management, the Mahatma Gandhi University has informed us that the course sought by us is not included in the UGC's approved nomenclature and could not be considered. Instead, they have suggested to submit MTTM (Master of Tourism and Travel Management), the UGC approved P G programmes under Hotel Management/Hospitality/Tourism/Travel disciplines. The Board may therefore consider the matter whether to wait for the UGC approval or to proceed with MTTM.
